# Project Narrative: "Where Does IT Go?" animation by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago

You flush your toilet, pour something down a sink, or wash a load of laundry, but have you ever wondered what happens to all of that dirty water after it leaves your home? The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) answers that question and more in its newly released children's animation inspired by its storybook titled "Where Does IT Go?". The animation is available in English, Spanish and Chinese and can be viewed at <u>youtube.com/c/metropolitanwaterreclamationdistrict</u>.

"Where Does IT Go?" introduces the MWRD's Water Science Explorers, a cast of fictional characters, Yadira, Paul, and Jessica. These students are curious and wonder what happens when they flush the toilet. They embark on a special mission in a magical vehicle to uncover the mystery of where pee, poop, and toilet paper go.

The animation was created in-house by the MWRD Office of Public Affairs (PA) which also created the illustrations for the storybook. The book has been distributed for free to over 14,000 people; while it was designed and distributed to students enrolled in grades four and up, the animation reaches students of all ages through its visuals, sounds, and motions.

The "Where Does IT Go?" animation is the first of its kind for the MWRD. The PA team was seeking a creative and colorful way to explain the wastewater treatment process to its 5.2 million residents and especially to its K-12 community. The PA team created a script that includes actual dialogue the team encounters when speaking with students during community outreach events. For example, when asked what they think happens after they flush the toilet, many students have said, "I always thought pee and poop went down to the sewer and found its way to the ocean."

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An understanding of the residents in Cook County required that we appeal to languages that are most reflected in our service area, including Chinese, English, and Spanish. In addition to relatable dialogue, one of the featured voices in the Spanish animation is Eira L. Corral Sepúlveda, who was the first Latina to join the MWRD Board of Commissioners. In addition, her son performed the role of "Paul."

"As the daughter of immigrants, I know that language barriers can prevent families from feeling comfortable engaging with government offices," said Commissioner Corral Sepúlveda. "By creating and publishing this animation, the more than 1 million Spanish-speakers of Cook County will be able to see themselves reflected in MWRD's mission and service delivery. That is why it was particularly special for me and my son to be a part of the recording!"

Recording the voice actors was no easy feat during the pandemic, but technology allowed staff to coordinate actors and equipment safely and successfully while following CDC guidelines. As a result, the video integrates exciting sound effects, a moving soundtrack and actual photos and video, including historical photos from the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century to drone footage filmed by the PA team's drone pilots.

The PA team began promoting both the book and animation to 1,800 MWRD staff earlier this year. A dedicated landing page at <u>www.mwrd.org/where-does-it-go</u> was developed and outreach components included e-blasts; social media posts; mailing fliers to hundreds of libraries, schools, and municipality leaders; as well as distributions at community outreach events. The promotional strategy included a timely release of each video – the English version was released in April 2021 to celebrate Earth Day; the Chinese version was released in May 2021 to celebrate Asian Pacific American

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Heritage Month; and the Spanish version was released in September 2021 to celebrate Hispanic/Latinx Heritage Month. The goal is to reach as many Cook County students as possible with this innovative tool which explains complex subject matter in a fun and entertaining way while inspiring the next generation of water professionals.

"We are happy to offer this comprehensive learning experience for students," said MWRD President Kari K. Steele. "Just like the book, the animation is great educational entertainment that anyone can view from the comfort of their home. Cook County parents, guardians, and educators have been encouraged to host their own family night or STEM watch party."



# HOW TO HOST A "WHERE DOES IT GO?" STEAM MOVIE NIGHT

- Order FREE print copies of the WDIG storybook (available in English, Spanish, Chinese, Polish) from the MWRD for event attendees to receive at the event. (Open to Cook County residents, while supplies last.)
- Ask students to bring 1-2 empty rolls of toilet paper to event for a STEAM activity.

#### Visit MWRD YouTube channel and pick version (English, Chinese, Spanish) to show.

- Take photos and post to social media. Tag the MWRD and use #MWRDwheredoesitgo so that we can repost or email us at communityeducation@mwrd.org.
- After the animation ends, play a trivia game. Keep score and send the winner's name to the MWRD for a special WDIG gift, which will be mailed to the winner for free. (Open to Cook County residents and subject to availability.)
- Distribute **print copies** of WDIG and encourage students to complete the STEM activities inside the book at a later date.

**Closing STEAM Activity: STEM + ART = STEAM** Celebrate the animals who rely on our local waterways. They include fish, ducks, turtles, frogs, etc.

Recycle empty toilet paper roll and use to create your favorite animal from our local waterways. Tools needed include toilet paper roll, markers, glue, construction paper, scissors, and eye stickers. Create sample animals and prepare and cut helpful shapes so students can easily assemble animal. For older students, ask them to make three dimensional animals.




